


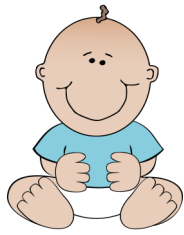
Thoughtful Thursday— Procrastinating/Homework/Uniqueness

CULTURAL CORNER



Dr. Maulana Karenga, professor and chairman of Black Studies at California State University, Long Beach, created Kwanzaa in 1966. He searched for ways to bring African-Americans together as a community. The name Kwanzaa is derived from the phrase “matunda ya kwanza” which means “first fruits” in Swahili. On each of the seven nights of Kwanzaa, the family gathers and a child lights one of the candles on the Kinara (candleholder), then one of the seven principles is discussed. The principles

are values of African culture which contribute to building and reinforcing community among African-Americans.

Kwanzaa also has seven basic symbols which represent values and concepts reflective of African culture. An African feast, called a Karamu, is held on December 31.
