Thomas Talks—Safety!



Another reminder regarding safety. We all desire our campus to be a safe environment for our students. Safety starts with adults. It is the job of all adults including principal, GIS, teachers, staff, and parents to keep our students safe. Please remember when driving to school you are in a school zone. The speed limit in a school zone is 25 mph. I suggest moving more slowly when you are closer to start times as there are so many students and you can never be too safe. Unfortunately, our crosswalks have become an extremely dangerous location. I am asking for extreme caution when coming to either of our crosswalks. When a crossing guard is in the crosswalk, regardless of where the guard is in that crosswalk, it is illegal to continue our vehicle through the crosswalk. It is very confusing and completely unsafe for students who see the crossing guard step out to cross and then have cars speed through the crosswalk before children step out. Children are being trained to not step into the crosswalk until the crossing guard has waved them on because of the unpredictability of drivers. Please be cautious during drop off and pick up times. We have had so many narrow escapes with students who utilize our crosswalks. Slowing down, being patient, and planning ahead make all of the difference in keep our children safe.

Spelling Bee!

Fugman Spelling Bee Team spelling test will be administered at 7:45 am in room 11 on Thursday, Nov. 15th. All 4th, 5th, & 6th graders are eligible to participate.

California State Spelling Championship for Elementary Students

Fugman will be participating again in the Fresno County Spell-Off (Grades 4-6). Each participating school district will send TWO representatives in the elementary division to compete in the Fresno County Spell-Off. This will be an oral competition.

The top 2 winners from the Fresno County Office of Education's annual County Spell-Off to will represent Fresno County in the California State Spelling Championships. The top winner overall will compete in the National Spelling Bee near Washington D.C. For further information regarding the county spelling bee please visit <http://ela.fcoe.org/spell-off>

The First step in the process is to select a team to represent Fugman in the District competition which will be held in February 2019. A written spell off test will be administered to all interested kids in 4th, 5th and 6th grade on Thursday, Nov. 15th at 7:45 am in room 11. Students will be selected from each grade and these 12 kids will form the Fugman team that will participate in the district competition. These selected 12 students will also get credit for Block F.

Mr. Ken Engel, 3rd Grade teacher (Rm 11) will be the coordinator for conducting the tests, scoring, and selecting the team. Ananya Vinay (Scripps National Spelling Bee Champion 2017) will provide coaching and training sessions to the selected team.
