PBIS Update

Positive Behavior Intervention and Support is the framework for our school-wide behavior system. We started this year rotating through all of the settings visited each day by students including bathrooms, cafeteria, library, office, and other important areas. At each rotation, students were taught the expected behaviors for that area and what behavior should look like if we were following our school-wide acronym SWIM: Show Character, Work Hard, Include Everyone and Make Wise Choices. Teachers, administration and support staff are now reinforcing these behaviors with tickets. These tickets can be used at our SWIM store each week. Be sure to ask your child about the expectations and find out if they have earned a SWIM ticket!

Nurse Notes

As we continue to get settled in for a healthy and safe school year, we'd like to remind our families of the many ways in which we can support your children, along with the ways in which you can help us to ensure their health and safety.

We see and treat students for minor illnesses and injuries, store and provide daily and emergency medications on an individual basis with physician orders, provide education and referrals for acute and chronic health concerns, communicate student health needs and orders with other staff members as needed, and respond to emergencies on campus. To provide these services in a safe manner, California Ed Code Section 49423 requires each student to have written permission from his/her physician and parent/guardian for the administration of any medication while at school. This includes all prescription and over-the-counter medication. These permissions are required with each new school year, and the forms are available on our website or in the health office. Please also note that use of crutches, wheelchairs and other devices require a doctor's prescription indicating directions for use and that the student has been educated to use the device. If you have any questions about this, please feel free to call our office at 327-8688.
